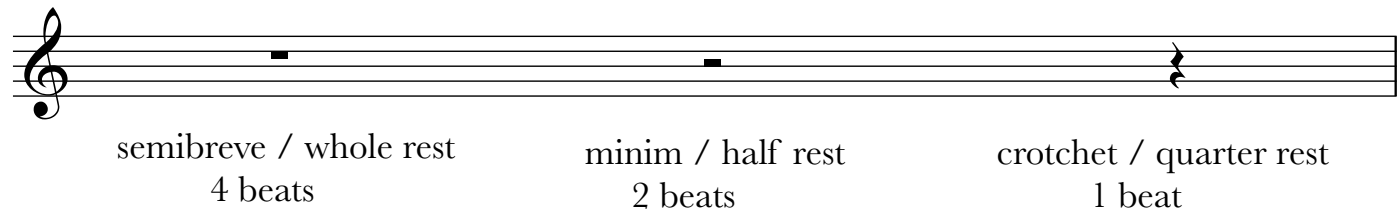


Lesson 4: Rests, the dotted half note (dotted minim) and D

Rests

A rest is a symbol which indicates one or more beats of silence:



Remember to keep counting the beats during the rests.

Silent rests



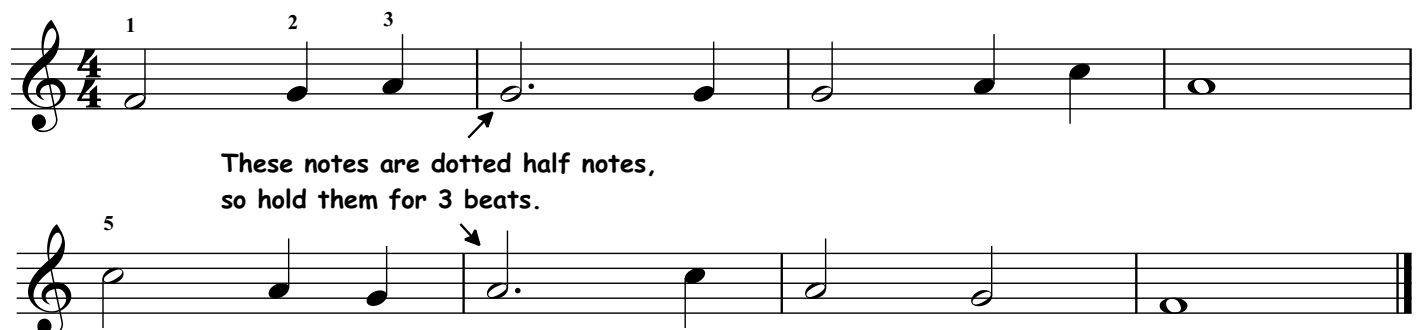
The dotted half note (dotted minim)

A dotted half note (dotted minim) looks just like a half note (minim) but has a dot just to the right of the note.

It is **3** beats long.

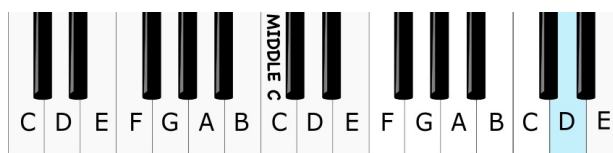


Spot On!



Right hand plays D

D is the note just to the right of C.



This is how D is written. The note head is on the second line down.



D is delightful!

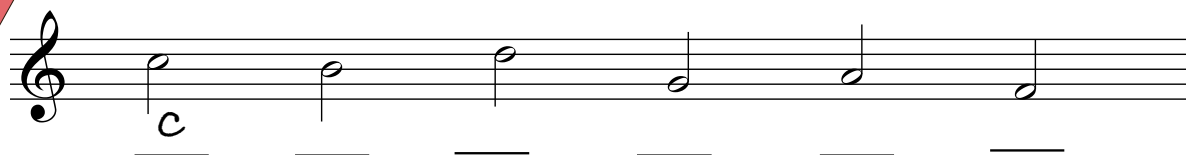


Lightly Row
