

Lesson 6: Playing with both hands

When you are playing with both hands, the music is written on two staves (a staff is a set of 5 lines upon which the notes are written). The top staff shows the right hand notes and the bottom staff shows the left hand notes. The staves are bracketed together.

When they are formatted like this they are known as a *grand staff*.

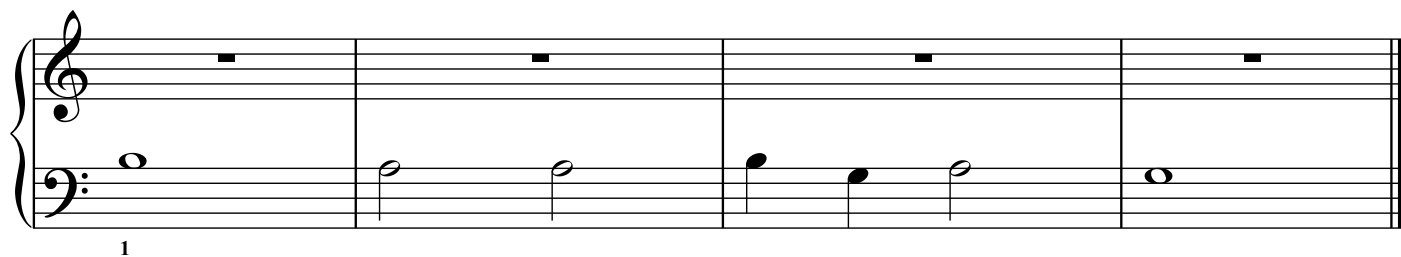
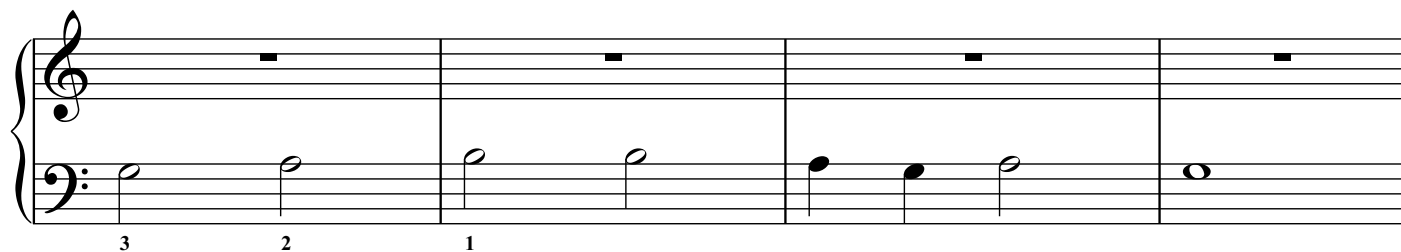
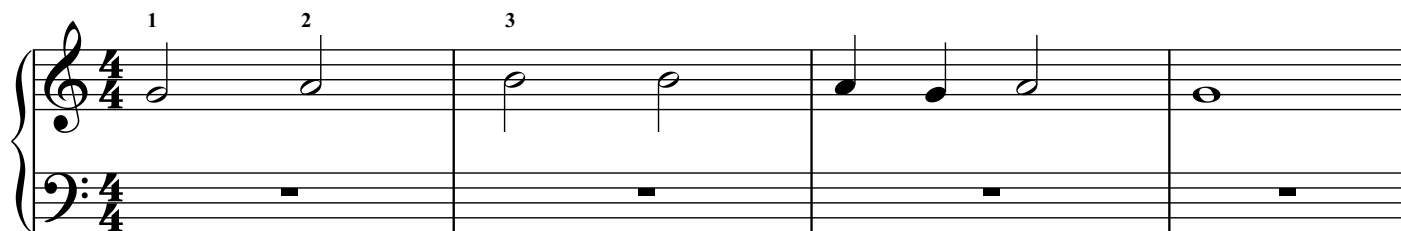
